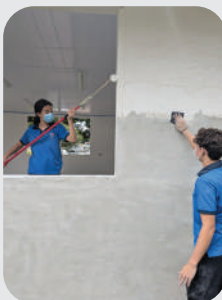
Verbal Mentions: Judy Wu (Year 8) and Isabella Jiménez Somarriba (Year 9)
