


Year 5's Egg-cellent Challenge: Forces, Gravity, and Protection!






Maths Olympiad Final Successes

Year 9 Service Learning Project

As part of the Service Learning projects, Y9A focused on supporting the work of the ALCCI (Asociación Lucha Contra el Cáncer Infantil) and Giamala, foundations, organizations committed to education, early detection, and accompaniment during the treatment of childhood and adolescent cancer.

During the two visits made, the students had the opportunity to visit the shelters of both foundations, interact with the beneficiary children, as well as with the families facing the challenges associated with the disease. In addition, they delivered the donation resulting from the campaign held at the School weeks ago, which managed to raise a total amount of \$\psi\$457, 200, divided equally between both foundations. Year 9 Social Studies Field Trip

Last Wednesday, October 22nd, we had the opportunity to go with Year 9 to Hacienda La Chimba. The objective was to complement the aspects seen in the Social Studies class with the students, related to the beginning, development, and current situation of coffee in Costa Rica. This activity fostered the School values of independence and especially responsibility, as the aim was for each student to have a close-up experience of learning how the process of coffee production, processing, and export develops.

The field trip consisted of three parts. In the first part, the group entered a trail through the coffee plantations (approximately 3 km), where they could appreciate the different production soils, cultivation techniques, and of course, a beautiful landscape. The second part consisted of a tour about the types of coffee, production techniques, and ways of processing this product, in addition to tasting the different types of coffee. Finally, we enjoyed a delicious lunch at the hacienda's restaurant. The students not only enjoyed themselves but also reinforced their learning process with a very positive attitude.
