
Last day of classes for Early Years 1 to Year 9 Students

Service Learning

The Y7 project aimed to raise awareness about the rights and well-being of people with disabilities. To develop their project, they had the opportunity to visit and spend time with the users of CAIPAD ACIOSA. This NGO contributes to the inclusion of more than 42 adults with disabilities. During their visit, they led physical, artistic, and recreational activities that greatly contributed to their overall development. They also donated a speaker and microphones, which will allow them to carry out their activities effectively. Both our Y7A and Y7B students and the ACIOSA users enjoyed this activity.

For their part, Y8B concluded their project at the Calle 8 Camp of the Chepe se baña Foundation. This project focuses on promoting social awareness and respect for human dignity among people experiencing homelessness. During their visit, the Y8B students carried out activities aimed at meeting basic needs such as food, preparing sandwiches and slushies that were very welcome on a sunny morning. They will also be delivering the donations they collected as part of the project, mainly clothing and hygiene items. This arduous task allowed them to witness firsthand the reality of many people experiencing homelessness in our country, as well as the efforts made by the organizations and volunteers who support this population every day.
